



# **Using Transcripts & Captions**



Most Lecture Videos should have transcripts and captions which present audio content as text. Transcripts and captions are critical for people with hearing impairments, and are extremely useful for second language students, or students who wish to search for specific topics in the lectures.

In some cases, when captions were not possible to generate, there may be downloadable transcripts available.

### 1. Captions



If a recording has captions, they will show by default at the bottom of the video when you watch the video online in Amathuba. You can toggle the captions on or off using the Closed Captions (CC) button below the video player.



### 2. Interactive Transcripts

If there are captions, the interactive transcript will be available in the **Transcript** tab below the video player.

Interactive transcripts allow you to:

- Follow the transcript text as the video plays
- Search for keywords
- Jump to a section in the video by clicking the text












If there are captions, you will find a downloadable text file (VTT) of the transcript. Click on the download button • to download it.











Note a VTT file has timestamps, for example below. It can be opened in Notepad, TextEdit or even your browser.
